

# When will I get my COVID-19 vaccine?

1	Residents in a care home for older adults and staff working in care homes for older adults	Hospitals and GP practices are working with care home providers to book their staff in to vaccination clinics.	<b>Commenced December 2020</b> in some areas. Some areas are preparing to commence.
2	All those 80 years of age and over and frontline health and social care workers	<p>Patients aged 80 and above who are already attending hospital as an outpatient, and those who are being discharged home after a hospital stay.</p> <p>Other patients aged 80 and over and some extremely clinically vulnerable patients are being invited by their GP practice to attend for a vaccination at a hub.</p> <p>Patients aged 80 and over who live within 45 minutes of the national vaccination centres are being written to, by NHS England, to book an appointment. The vaccination centres closest to Derby are Millennium Point, Birmingham and Etihad Stadium, Manchester.</p> <p>Eligible staff are being vaccinated in hospitals or GP practices.</p>	<p><b>Commenced December 2020</b></p> <p><b>Commenced December 2020 and ongoing.</b> New sites are being launched each week. Patients will be contacted when their vaccine is available, and should not call their practice.</p> <p><b>Commenced January 2021.</b> Patients do not have to take up this offer and will not miss out. Patients can choose to wait for the invitation for a vaccine to arrive from their GP.</p> <p>There are plans for a vaccination centre to be launched in Derbyshire, (details to follow).</p> <p><b>Commenced in December 2020, and from January 2021</b> hospital and social care staff outside of care homes will be vaccinated at our hospital hubs in Derby and Chesterfield. GP practice staff will be vaccinated by their own practice.</p>
3	All those 75 years of age and over	Vaccinations aren't currently being rolled out for patients aged between 75 and 79.	We anticipate that this will commence in February.

4	All those 70 years of age and over and clinically extremely vulnerable individuals (not including pregnant women and those under 16 years of age)	Some extremely clinically vulnerable staff have been vaccinated by their employer or the NHS. Vaccinations aren't currently being rolled out to other clinically extremely vulnerable individuals.  Vaccinations aren't currently being rolled out for patients aged between 70 and 74.	We anticipate that this will commence during February. You will be contacted when your vaccine is available.  We anticipate that this will commence during February. You will be contacted when your vaccine is available.
5	All those 65 years of age and over	Vaccinations aren't currently being rolled out for patients aged between 65 and 69.	We anticipate that this will commence during February. You will be contacted when your vaccine is available.
6	Adults aged 16 to 65 years in an at-risk group ( <a href="#">at-risk group definition</a> )	Vaccinations aren't currently being rolled out for patients aged between 16 and 64 in at risk groups.	We anticipate that this will commence during February. You will be contacted when your vaccine is available.
7	All those 60 years of age and over	Vaccinations aren't currently being rolled out for patients aged between 60 and 64.	We anticipate that this will commence during the spring. You will be contacted when your vaccine is available.
8	All those 55 years of age and over	Vaccinations aren't currently being rolled out for patients aged between 55 and 69.	We anticipate that this will commence during the spring. You will be contacted when your vaccine is available.
9	All those 50 years of age and over	Vaccinations aren't currently being rolled out for patients aged between 50 and 54.	We anticipate that this will commence during the spring. You will be contacted when your vaccine is available.
10	Rest of the population (to be determined)	-	We anticipate that this will commence during the spring. You will be contacted when your vaccine is available.

**Please wait your turn.** If you are not in the groups above, you will have to wait for a COVID-19 vaccination until more supplies are available. When more vaccine becomes available we will be offering it to more groups of the population.

Please **do not call or visit your GP practice to find out when you will be vaccinated**, you will be contacted when it is your turn, this includes patients who are shielding.

Patients will be receiving an initial vaccine dose at their first appointment. **Second vaccination doses are not currently being prioritised** to ensure the available vaccine can be distributed widely across the UK. **Everyone will still receive their second dose** within 12 weeks of their first. The second dose completes the course and is important for longer term protection.

## How to get your COVID-19 vaccination

**If you are over 80 there are three ways you might be contacted to get your vaccination. Please do not try to book a vaccination if you have not received a letter.**

**1 Using a local GP service:** GP services are working together in your area to vaccinate as many people as possible. You may be contacted by a different surgery to the one you usually go to.

**2 Local hospital services:** You might be contacted to have the vaccination as an inpatient or outpatient.

**3 At a vaccination centre:** If you live within 30 to 45 minutes of a vaccination centre, and haven't already been vaccinated, you may have received a letter asking you to book an appointment online at [www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination](http://www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination). Or if you can't access the NHS website you can **call 119 free of charge**.

If you can't travel to a vaccination centre, or there is another reason you can't book an appointment at the nearest vaccination centre, you can choose to wait until your local GP services contact you if they haven't already. If this is your preferred option – you don't need to do anything now – wait for your GP service to make contact. More locations will become available through [www.nhs.uk](http://www.nhs.uk) or 119 in the coming weeks so you could also try there again later.

If you receive a letter and already have an appointment booked to have your vaccination at a local GP service please ignore the letter. There is nothing you need to do and please attend your appointment.

**If you have had your first jab, you will be contacted about getting your second.**
